What is DCYF Career Connected Pathways (CCP)?

- DCYF Career Connected Pathways (CCP) helps young people find a job that is the "right fit" for them. That includes internships, apprenticeships, pre-apprenticeships, and more.
- CCP services include career exploration and planning, support with job application process, cover letters and resumes, job interview tips and practice, and connection to regional employment programs.

Who is eligible for CCP?

Young people aged 15 to 26 who are currently experiencing or have experienced state or tribal foster care. This includes young people involved with the Education and Training Voucher (ETV), Extended Foster Care (EFC), Independent Living, and/or Treehouse programs.

When is CCP available?

Services are available year-round.

Where is CCP and how can I access it?

This is a statewide, youth-led, voluntary program. CCP connects with regional communities that support young people pursuing the career goals of their choosing.

Why should I try CCP?

- This program meets young people where they are and prioritizes providing human-centered and trauma-informed support.
- Young people have a voice in creating goals and taking steps toward their chosen career path in partnership with staff. If a young person decides to pursue a different career path, they have the opportunity and support to do so.
