<u>Priority Points</u>: This document can be used to reference the risk factors that ECEAP takes into consideration when determining if an over-income child is eligible for ECEAP.

<u>Federal Poverty Level Chart</u>: This can be used to reference what the income limits for income eligibility are for families. Children are income-eligible for ECEAP if they are from families at or below 110 percent of the Federal Poverty Level.

<u>ECEAP Revised Code of Washington</u>: These are the laws enacted by the Washington State Legislature about ECEAP (scroll down to sections 43.216.500-43.216.576).

<u>Licensing for Early Learning Providers</u>: DCYF licenses approximately 6,000 child care centers and family home child care providers in Washington. Licensed child care providers follow minimum licensing requirements set by the state to ensure children in licensed care are in safe, healthy and nurturing places.
