




Parent-Child Assistance Program (PCAP)

- 3-year intensive case management program
- 15 PCAP locations
- Serving 20 counties
- 1,490 client slots contracted
- Medicaid and State funded



Parent-Child Assistance Program services

Assistance in accessing and using local resources





Referral, support, and advocacy for substance use disorder treatment and continuing care.



Linkages to health care and appropriate therapeutic interventions for children.



Timely advocacy based on client needs.




University of Washington Addictions, Drug and Alcohol Institute (ADAI)

- Formerly known as the Fetal Alcohol and Drug Unit (FADU)
- Seattle, WA University of Washington
- Provides to all PCAP sites around the state:
 - Quality Assurance
 - ► Implementation Fidelity
 - Staff Training
 - Program Data Collection and Evaluation
- Reports to DBHR:
 - ► Monthly PCAP Updates
 - Annual PCAP Report



DCYF dedicated PCAP slots

- HCA and DCYF interagency agreement
- Substance ExposedNewborn (SEN) diagnosis
- Clallam-Jefferson, King, Yakima, Spokane PCAP sites
- Each site dedicates 14 client slots



Budget overview PCAP case management

ESSB 5187, 215 (55): \$603,000 (\$250,000 GF-S) in both FY2024 & FY2025

DCYF initiated
Decision
Package for
expansion

56 client slots increased by end of FY2025

Partnering with PCAP providers & DCYF to determine expansion agreements

Updating agreement to reflect DCYF client eligibility

Estimation of contract decisions within next 3 months



Budget overview PCAP Rate Increase

ESSB 5187, Sec 215 (46):

\$505,000 of the general fund—state appropriation for fiscal year 2024 \$1,011,000 of the general fund—state appropriation for fiscal year 2025

\$1,095,000 of the general fund—federal appropriation

Increase rates by 15 percent

Effective January 1, 2024




