Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF) Updates

DCYF Releases 2024 Cost of Care & Market Rate Survey Report

DCYF is excited to release its <u>2024 Cost of Quality Care and Market Rate Study Report</u>. The report can be found at the bottom of the <u>Child Care and Development Fund</u> webpage, as well as on the <u>Find a Report</u> webpage.

The report works as an essential tool for Washington state when establishing Working Connections Child Care subsidy reimbursement rates paid to providers serving children receiving subsidy benefits. Strong rates are critical to supporting access to quality early care and education for Washington's children.

State law requires subsidy rates to be set according to the market rate. Rates are currently based on 2021 market rate data. This report assists policymakers to decide the basis for subsidy rates moving forward. Policymakers will need to determine whether rates will be based on market rates or the cost of quality care.

Rule Making Update - Rules Under Development

Working Connections Child Care – Eligibility

The Washington State Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF) Early Learning Division is amending rules on the eligibility requirements for child care and food assistance. DCYF is also amending rules to allow the following programs to be an approved activity for eligibility: birth to three Early Childhood Education and Assistance Program (ECEAP) and early Head Start programs. These amendments are required by legislation. More information can be found in WSR 24-14-053.

Working Connections Child Care - Infant Enhancement Rate, Nonstandard Hours Bonus

The DCYF Early Learning Division is revising the infant enhancement rate and non-standard hours bonus rate to align with legislative requirements. More information can be found in WSR 24-14-034. On July 1, 2024, these rules went into effect under emergency status

Working Connections and Seasonal Child Care Subsidy Programs

The Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF) Early Learning Division is revising Chapter 110-15 WAC Working Connections and Seasonal Child Care Subsidy Programs. The purpose of this rule-making is to clarify and update language to transition operations from Department or Social and Health Services (DSHS) to DCYF and use plain talk as required by Executive Order 23-02. The notice of intent for this rule-making was filed under WSR 24-15-069 on July 17, 2024.
