#### COVID-19 RESOURCES FOR CHILD CARE AND EARLY LEARNING PROVIDERS

Child care programs are crucial to healthcare workers, first responders and other essential workers who are unable to work remotely during this time. Below is supplementary guidance for providers regarding COVID-19. We have also included supports to help early learning providers continue with operations during this difficult time.

### **Disinfecting and Sanitation Recommendations**

For providers continuing their operations, current evidence from the CDC suggests COVID-19 may remain viable for hours to days on surfaces of a variety of materials. Additional cleaning and disinfecting of your environment and materials is best practice for prevention of COVID-19. ## **Outdoor Play**

Outdoor play is fundamental to children's growth and development. Providers should continue to take children outdoors as part of their daily schedule. Any outdoor equipment, activities and toys touched by children may need additional cleaning and disinfecting during this time.

### **Early Achievers**

As of March 17, 2020, Early Achievers data collection visits are suspended. Once programming returns to typical operation, the data collection team will work with early learning programs to ensure a smooth rescheduling process. Participants can email **Child Care Aware** for on-going coaching supports.

### **State Substitute Pool**
