- Follow existing implementation of legislation. The PIFS CRP will also follow proposed legislation. Review of legislation and impact to policy and practice at DCYF.
- Continue SUD, POSC, Housing Review
- Data transparency on child abuse and neglect allegations.
- CSEC policy and practice at DCYF.
- Forensic interviewing during investigations and the impact of training and MDT.
- DCYF MH policy, stabilization of youth and families in-home. Review CBOs and services that meet needs of families with significant MH and behavioral needs.
