If the initial screening decision is changed by the local office, the final screening decision follows the guidance outlined above as in regards to contact and coordination expectations with the Tribe(s).


2. Where do I locate the current list of Tribes and special requirements to contact and coordinate with Tribes?



## Screen Shot 2 - Washington State Tribes - Intake Referral and After Hours Field Response Contact Information Link:




# 3. How do I obtain ICW Information to help determine if a family is affliated with a Tribe?

ICW information is required to be collected from the referent at intake. If no information is known or provided by the referrer, intake staff can also review FamLink records, such as the ICW status located on the ICW Page of Person Management (See Screen Shot 3).

You can also look for ICW information in **previous intakes**, **case notes** with "Staffing – LICWAC/Tribal," etc.
