RE: Changes to 1120. Safety Assessment policy

EFFECTIVE DATE: July 1, 2023

SUNSET REVIEW DATE: July 1, 2024

Purpose

The purpose of this memo is to provide guidance to Child Welfare (CW) employees of the updated policy and procedure requirements to align with House Bill 1227: Keeping Families Together Act, KW, and LCS supreme court decisions.

This policy is under full review for further revisions, but the following changes will take effect July 1, 2023:

New Procedural Requirements

Caseworkers must:

- Complete a Safe Child Consultation to support decisions related to safety by following the Safe Child Consultation Guide.
- Apply the Child Safety Framework during the Safe Child Consultation to:
 - o Determine if a child or youth is safe and if either:
 - A safety plan is needed
 - Removing a child from a parent or guardian is necessary to prevent imminent physical harm to the child or youth due to abuse or neglect.
