# 2024-25 Comprehensive Early Learning Application Resources

This document is not required to be submitted as part of the Request for Application (RFA) process but is intended as a resource document for the applicant. Resources listed here are referenced in the RFA and may be helpful in completing the application.

## **Documents Referenced**

- Sample <u>ECEAP Statement of Work (SOW)</u>: This is a sample of the Statement of Work in the ECEAP contract that is signed by DCYF and the contractor.
- <u>2023-2024 ECEAP Performance Standards</u>: These are the minimum requirements for ECEAP service delivery.
- <u>Birth-3 ECEAP Performance Standards</u>: These are the minimum requirements for Birth-3 ECEAP service delivery.
- <u>Minimum ECLIPSE Service Delivery Requirements</u>: These are the minimum requirements for ECLIPSE service delivery.
- <u>Research and Data Analysis (RDA)</u>: This is a report of the state and county estimates for the ECLIPSE eligible population.
- <u>ECEAP Directors Roster</u>: This is the list of ECEAP Contractor Directors for 2023-2024. This can be used to locate contact information for ECEAP contractors in your proposed service area.
- <u>RFA Program Finder</u>: This document can be used to locate ECEAP contractors and Head Start grantees in your site-specific school district to collaborate in serving families.
- <u>ECEAP and Head Start Saturation Study</u>: This Saturation Study can help in your planning for ECEAP expansion. DCYF will also reference this document to help make decisions about slot placement in communities. The study will be updated soon. For the latest version of the Saturation Study, check the <u>ECEAP reports webpage</u>.
- <u>DCYF ECEAP Priority Points</u>: This document can be used to reference the risk factors that ECEAP takes into consideration when determining if a child whose family exceeds 36% of the State Median Income (ESE) is eligible for ECEAP.
- <u>State Median Income (SMI) Chart:</u> This can be used to reference what the income limits are for eligible ECEAP families. Children are income-eligible for ECEAP if they are from families at or below 36% of the State Median Income (SMI).
