The Center for Early Relational Health (CERH), previously known as the Washington Association for Infant Mental Health, offers different levels of endorsement credentials and provides recognition of specialized knowledge in professionals who are working with families and young children, including Early Support for Infants and Toddlers (ESIT) Professionals. This endorsement is an internationally recognized credential, designed for professionals in the fields of early care and education, prevention and early intervention, home visiting, medical and behavioral health professions, child welfare, mental health, policy and advocacy, research, and others.
