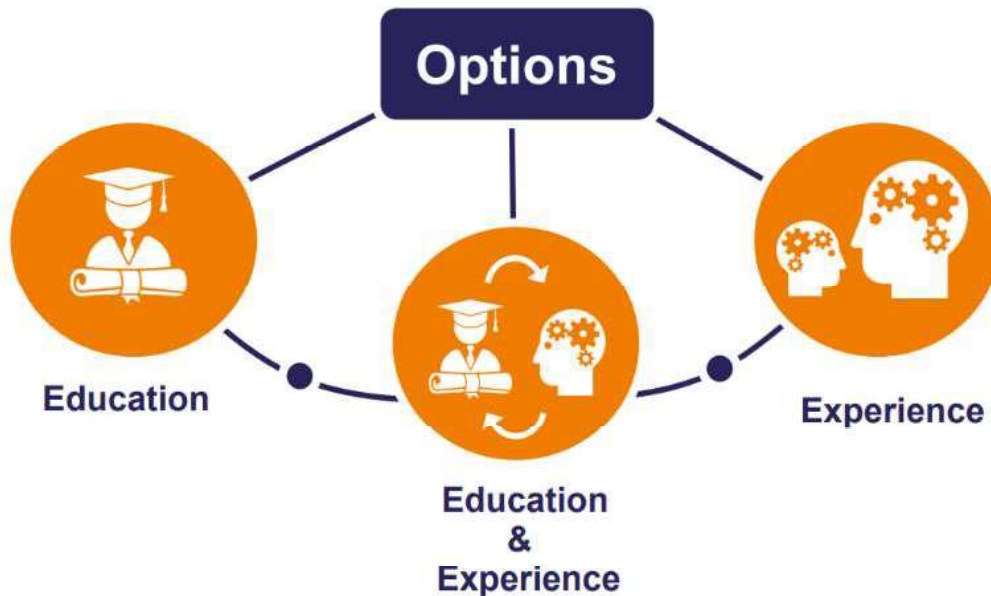




Education Staff Qualifications

This publication is intended to provide an update on the education requirements outlined in [WAC 110-300-0100](#). Some options are currently under development and will become available as soon as they are finalized. Please note that as we develop new options for meeting WAC requirements, this will not impact the ability to accomplish requirements within the 5-year period.

All providers have 3 options and 5 years to meet WAC requirements



Education requirements do NOT have to be completed by August 1, 2019.

The law states that all providers have five years to meet WAC requirements:

“Providers shall be given five years from August 1, 2019, or five years’ from being employed or promoted into positions at any licensed early learning program to meet requirements.”

2. Equivalentents:

- **Community Based Option:**
 - This will be a package training option that can meet the education licensing standards.
 - Currently under development, and available in 2020.
 - DCYF is working with The Imagine Institute, Child Care Aware of Washington, & WA State Board of Community and Technical Colleges to establish this option.
- **Alternate Credentials:**

Hiring Early Learning Professionals
