Sign up to be a **TEMPORARY RESIDENTIAL YOUTH WORKER**



The Department of Children, Youth, and Families is recruiting for a pool of temporary, on-call staff who can step in to work at various youth Behavior Rehabilitation Services facilities in Washington if the need arises. We are looking for full-time staff (40-hour per week), as well as anyone who wants to work on a per-shift basis.

This role will work on-site at one of these youth group homes to supervise and support youth residents and to carry out the day-to-day activities and operations of a residential program. These staff will be part of a team responsible for helping traumatized children and youth through a very stressful crisis while ensuring program and facility safety.

This is a great role for anyone who has experience as a:

- Social worker
- Substance use disorder professional
- Visitation provider
- K-12 paraeducators and other classified staff
- Mental health professional

We are looking for people who meet the following requirements:

- Be at least 21 years of age.
- Have recently had a background check conducted.
- A high school diploma or equivalent (GED/HSEC).
- Skills and ability to work successfully with the special needs of children in care.
- Experience working directly with children or youth.
- Effective communication and problem solving skills.
