What is the ELF K-12 School **District Program?**

The ELF program supports Washington's commitment of developing additional high quality early learning opportunities for children from low-income households.

The program enables K-12 school districts to expand, remodel, purchase or construct early learning facilities and classrooms to increase and/or retain capacity at risk of being lost, which is necessary to support statefunded Early Childhood Education and Assistance Program (ECEAP) and Work connection opportunities. Who May Apply?

This program is only open to K-12 school districts. Applicants must be or intend to be;

- An active participant in Early Achievers program.
- Have a Washington State business license to provide early learning services.
- Early Learning Childhood Education program (ECEAP) provider AND/OR Working Connections Child Care (WCCC) provider.

Where to Apply?

Apply to the Department of Commerce electronically through Zoom Grants.
