


Become a Foster Parent

Choosing to foster is a personal journey. We are here to support you along the way, from beginning steps to completing the licensing process.

Some of the supports you will receive as a foster parent include:

- Support from the Caregiver Retention, Education and Support (CaRES) program
- Access to high quality training from the Alliance for Child Welfare Excellence
- Monthly foster care reimbursement depending on age and needs
- Mileage reimbursement for transportation
- Respite care
- Child care assistance for working foster parents
- Medical, dental, and vision insurance for children and youth placed in care
- Washington State Foster Home Camping Program and Pass Programs at the Pacific Science Center, Woodland Park Zoo, Seattle Aquarium, and more.

LICENSING PROCESS

- Attend pre-service training
- Submit application and background check authorization
- Complete home study requirements
- Meet with staff for home visits and interviews

Process takes approximately 120 days from application to license.

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
