What is Negotiated Rule Making (NRM):

DCYF is amending the Group Care (110-145) Washington Administrative Code (WAC) through Negotiated Rule Making (NRM). NRM is a collaborative way to develop rules (WAC) by seeking consensus from groups made up of similar parties that are impacted by these rules. As impacted parties, those who have direct, personal experience with their children being placed in group care facilities are invited to participate in this rule making process.
