# What Is Strengthening Families Locally?



Strengthening Families Locally aims to increase family resilience and reduce rates of child maltreatment and entry into foster-care in target communities.

DCYF will **partner** with community organizations, government, tribes, schools, families, volunteers, and others in local communities to achieve these outcomes.

Funded by the Administration for Children and Families, this 5-year project started in 2019.

# DCYF seeks to partner with the community in service areas to:


- 1. Reduce rates of child maltreatment

- 4. Develop a replicable communitydriven prevention model





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
### **Service Area Selection**



- "Locales" that comprise 1 or more school districts; 20,000+ people (DSHS)
- Identified locales with top 20% of child welfare intakes
- Randomly selected 4 locales
- Sites:
  - Bremerton SD
  - Port Angeles/Sequim SDs
  - Spokane SD
  - Stevens Co.



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
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
#### Service Areas – Port Angeles/Sequim





# Service Areas - Spokane






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
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






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# **Target Area for Project Implementation**





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#### **Project Planning Process**

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# 6 Core Principles

- 1. Approaches will be strengths-based, culturally appropriate, and inclusive
- 2. Mobilization will occur at **multiple levels**, including state government, local government, local nonprofits, schools, families, volunteers, tribes, faith communities, etc., and will occur through a **variety of means**
- 3. We will work to develop **trust** and strengthen shared **values**
- 4. Our work will strengthen **community organizations**
- 5. Teams will develop a continuum of **information**, **services**, and **supports** to strengthen families
- 6. Communities will **target** interventions for families with **complex** and **co-occurring** risks





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# **Implications of Covid-19**



- Family and community needs are heightened
- Traditional protective systems compromised
- Community meetings: virtual, small-group, phone
- Lasting implications on educational, government, child welfare systems...?
